This video by **TradeShark Betfair Tennis Trading** (*Betfair Tennis Trading - Fernandez v Andreeva In Madrid*) scores **81/100**, representing an **authentic, transparent, and educational demonstration of live sports trading on the Betfair Exchange**.

Key Breakdown of the Score:

1. Authentic In-Play Execution & Order-Book Dynamics:

- Unlike the typical retail trading infomercials that show 3-minute cherry-picked winning highlights, this is a **raw, 28-minute single-match live trade**.
- It accurately reflects real-world market conditions: dealing with API stat delays from external scoreboards, Betfair market suspensions during changeovers, unmatched limit orders, and the discipline of scaling in with reduced stakes when optimal target prices (e.g. ~1.25 lay) are not fully reached.

2. Disciplined Risk & Liability Management:

- **Dynamic Hedging:** As soon as Fernandez broke Andreeva early, the trader immediately laid off risk to establish a **scratch break-even line (1.31)** and secure upside green.
- **Emotional & Momentum Profiling:** The trader actively tracked serving performance (first-serve percentages, points won on second serve) and psychological turning points (e.g. Andreeva saving 6 break points; Fernandez collapsing in the first-set tiebreak).
- **Decisive Exit Rules:** When the second set devolved into erratic break-trading and fatigue set in, the trader hedged out for profit across the match and closed the session rather than forcing uncontrolled exposure.

3. Areas for Improvement (Why it is 81, not 95+):

- **Discretionary Rule Drifts:** The trader openly acknowledged breaking his own predefined rules (e.g. placing an early speculative lay at 1.48 before hitting the planned 1.25 target price).
- **Absence of Quantitative Staking Formulas:** While grounded in sharp-bookmaker and OnCourt historical baselines, real-time staking is determined qualitatively rather than using strict fractional Kelly formulas.
