This video by **TradeShark Betfair Tennis Trading** (*Free Tennis Trading Tip - Sonmez v Kalieva in Memphis*) scores **82/100**, representing a **credible, grounded, and realistic example of pre-match tennis trading analysis**.

Key Reasons for the Score:

1. Nuanced Quality-of-Competition Analysis:

- Many naive statistical systems fail because they treat all match statistics equally. The presenter identifies that Kalieva's 12-month hold and serve figures are inflated due to playing primarily in lower-tier ITF tournaments, while Sönmez has been competing against higher-caliber opponents on the main WTA tour.
- This explains why Sönmez is priced as the \$1.50\$ favorite on Betfair despite trailing in raw 12-month service percentages.

2. Disciplined Price-Floor Strategy:

- Rather than placing a naked, negative-expectation pre-match bet at \$1.50\$, the trader establishes an in-play conditional setup:
 - Entry Target:** Back Sönmez only if in-match momentum or an early break drifts her price into the **\$2.10–2.30\$** window.
 - Risk Management:** Remove liability at **\$1.70\$** upon a recovery, leaving all accumulated green on the superior player.
 - Plan B:** Refuse entry if market odds fail to reach the value threshold.
