Critique & Score Justification

This video by Peter Webb (*Bet Angel*) is a biographical documentary and market-analysis breakdown focusing on the late **Daniel Gould**, a former history teacher who became the UK's most prominent professional Eurovision bettor (*Sofabet*).

Key Breakdown of Core Concepts:

1. Legitimate Structural Inefficiencies in Novelty/Entertainment Markets:

- Entertainment and novelty markets on the Betfair Exchange frequently suffer from slower price discovery and lower institutional competition compared to Premier League football or horse racing.
- The video accurately explains Gould's fundamental analytical edge:
 - **Diaspora & Geopolitical Voting:** Exploiting predictable historical voting corridors (e.g., Balkan, Nordic, and Eastern European diaspora blocs) during semi-final qualification stages.
 - **Multi-Modal Data Mining:** Tracking leading digital metrics (YouTube view velocity, Spotify streaming spikes, fan forum polling, and rehearsals via press credentials) ahead of mainstream market adjustment.
 - **Three-Phase In-Play Structure:** Detailing how prices move during live performance deliveries, the jury vote reveal, and the subsequent high-variance public televote.

2. The Risk-of-Ruin Caveat (-14 pts):
