Summary & Score Justification

This video by **Football Trading Life** (*The PRECISE Strategy We Used To Trade Football In French League*) scores extremely low due to its reliance on **black-box "AI" marketing buzzwords, dangerous in-play liability scaling, and fundamental statistical fallacies.**

Key Reasons for the Score:

1. The "AI / No Research" Illusion:

- The presenter boasts knowing "*absolutely zero*" about the French Ligue 2 teams and claims the "AI" does all the thinking in 20 seconds.
- In reality, the tool provides a generic retail sequence: **Lay Under 2.5 Goals at 15 minutes, add a second layer at 35–40 minutes.** This is not machine learning; it is a basic laddering mechanic sold as advanced artificial intelligence.

2. Asymmetric Risk & Ligue 2 Under-Pricing:

- French Ligue 2 is historically one of the lowest-scoring professional leagues in Europe (~2.20–2.35 goals/match baseline).
- Scaling into an Under 2.5 lay by queueing orders at 1.50 and 1.25 leaves the trader completely exposed. In matches where the first half finishes 0–0 (a very common occurrence in Ligue 2), the position is heavily underwater or completely lost, requiring multiple winning trades just to recover one full-loss deadlock.

3. The xG "Overdue Goal" Gambler's Fallacy:

- After the 33rd-minute goal, the presenter reviews the on-screen xG widget and states that the "*goal was due.*"
- Expected Goals (xG) is a descriptive measure of chance quality, not a predictive countdown timer. Assuming a goal *must* arrive because accumulated xG is rising commits the classic gambler's fallacy.

4. Commercial Product Pitch:

- The second half of the video transitions directly into a hard-sell pitch urging viewers to purchase "lifetime access" to their proprietary "xG Calculator" to "make their money back over a lifetime."
